One of the most memorable visits was from our local Fire and Rescue Service. The children had a fantastic time learning about the important work firefighters do to keep our community safe. They were able to try on real fire and rescue helmets and even climb into the fire truck, which created lots of excitement as we explored how firefighters help people in emergencies.

We also had a brilliant time celebrating World Book Day. The children spent the day taking part in a variety of activities inspired by the story 'Super Potato'. They enjoyed storytelling, creative tasks, and sensory activities linked to both the characters and the adventures from the book. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm for reading and their imaginative ideas.

During Careers Week, the children explored different jobs, and the skills people use in their roles. They especially enjoyed learning about being gardeners and photographers. The children planted their own beans, and we used some different tools to show how gardeners look after plants and help things to grow, we also explored how photographers capture special moments and tell stories through pictures.

These experiences have helped the children develop their curiosity, confidence, and understanding of the world around them. We are very proud of how engaged and enthusiastic they have been during all these activities. Our favourite experience was having all of you join us for our fun filled Easter afternoon!



Hedgehog Class

We have had such a great time in Hedgehog Class this term.

In the last half term, we have especially enjoyed reading 'The Gruffalo'; exploring all of the different animals. We were very active as we learned to move in different ways balancing, jumping and rolling were our favourite! We also looked at parts of our bodies as we joined in with action songs. We ended the half term with our very own Winter Olympics where we had a go at curling, sledging and hockey; everyone had great fun!

Our class book last half term was *The Gruffalo*, and we enjoyed lots of opportunities to be creative, role-playing parts of the story and using natural resources in our artwork. In Independence, we have been working on using knives to spread different things onto toast or crackers. We've got a bit messy, but it's been great to see the children trying the activities more confidently.



We had extra PE sessions with specialist PE instructors from Active Fusion last half term. We practised balancing and jumping safely off equipment. During one of our sessions, we tried out different activities themed around the Winter Olympics, including curling and tobogganing!

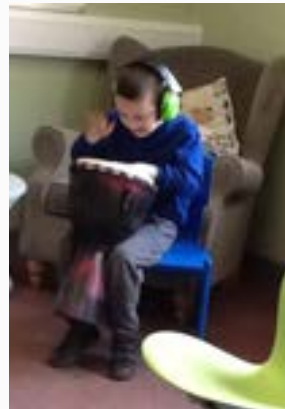

What a wonderfully busy and exciting term we have had! The children have taken part in a wide range of hands-on learning experiences that have supported their curiosity, imagination, and growing independence. We are delighted to share some of our favourite moments with you.



One of the biggest highlights was our fantastic visit from the Fire and Rescue Service. The children were thrilled to see a real fire engine and explore the equipment.

This term we have focused on two wonderful books: “The Gruffalo” and “Jasper’s Beanstalk.” The children have explored characters, settings, and story sequences through sensory trays, role-play, mark-making, and outdoor learning. “Jasper’s Beanstalk” also inspired some lovely early planting activities, helping the children understand growth and change.

World Book Day, 5th March, was filled with colour and creativity. The children loved dressing up, sharing stories, and exploring themed activities linked to their favourite books.

Careers Week gave us the chance to explore different jobs. The children tried being chefs, preparing simple foods; gardeners, planting seeds; photographers, taking pictures using classroom devices; and musicians! Their enthusiasm made the week a wonderful success.

We are very excited for our Easter Craft Afternoon on 25th March. We look forward to welcoming you for a fun and creative session.

Caterpillar Class

We have had a super busy and exciting term.

Inspired by our focus book, 'Jaspers Beanstalk', we have been exploring planting, we have linked this to our science lessons and created some fabulous instructions on how to plant seeds in English. The children have really enjoyed planting beans and cress. We have been taking photos of our bean plants every week to see how much they have grown. They are getting so big!



In Independence this term, we have been practising our cooking skills focusing on spreading and chopping. We have really enjoyed making some delicious sandwiches and chopping soft fruits like strawberries and Kiwi. Our favourite part was getting to eat what we had made.

This term, we have been very lucky to have had some fantastic experiences including a brilliant but noisy visit from the local fire brigade and their fire engine. We loved trying on the helmets and looking at the different equipment the firemen use. Some of us got to hear the siren and see the lights too. We also had a brilliant time at the sensory music experience in the hall when Sound Play came to visit.



Beaver Class

This term in beaver class we have been practising sharing and waiting our turn. We are getting very good!

In science this term we have been labelling the different body parts of humans and animals. We were amazing at labelling parts of animals especially parts we don't have ourselves. We were even able to group animals together to say which ones lived in the sea and on a farm.

We have also really enjoyed our topic of 'people who help us.' We have had some amazing visits from the Police and the local fire brigade. One of our highlights of the visits was being to sit in both the fire engine and the police car. We had a wonderful time when they allowed us to dress up in some of their uniform and we got to hold the fire hose.

This term we have been learning all about the Winter Olympics. We even participated in our own. We tried skeleton bobsleigh, ice hockey, and curling we even made and designed our own medals.



Fox Class

This term, Fox Class has enjoyed learning about the Chinese New Year- listening to stories about the celebration, The Year of the Horse, making decorations for the occasion and tasting foods associated with the celebration.

In Independence, the class have explored the meaning of words that they need to understand to keep safe by following instructions and moving around the school safely following these words.

In Science, Fox class have explored sound, how it travels and what effects its volume whilst in RSHE and Computing, the children have explored Internet Safety stories with the message to “stop” and “tell” an adult, asking for “help” if they see something they do not like. The children have amazing listening skills and have followed instructions brilliantly.

The school also enjoyed a visit from the Fire Brigade and explored the vehicles and equipment they use.

Mole Class

We have had a very busy time in Mole class this term.

Firstly, our class topic was Animals, and our class text was a beautifully written and illustrated book called 'Can't you sleep'. Our children loved this text and were able to use the recount skills that they have learned throughout the text to recount our visit to the cinema last term. We practised writing in the first person and using time words such as 'first', 'then' 'next' and 'finally'.



Sound was the next topic we covered in science. We explored how sound travels and we did some fabulous experiments – our favourite was making a telephone using plastic cups to show how sound travels down the string.

Our next topic was Famous Faces, and the class text was 'Ticket to Kalamazoo' – a lovely and quirky book full of zippy poems to read out aloud. We used this to begin our English theme – to write a poem. We began by looking at alliteration and did amazingly well as we thought of lots of examples of adjectives to describe vehicles from the poem.

During this term we were also able to celebrate World Book Day. The children were brilliant – we dressed up and spent the day completing some super reading challenges and classroom activities. We loved our visit to the hall where we could choose a large book and a bean bag to read together.



Seal Class

This term has been so busy in Seal class, and we have all been working hard. We have worked really hard on our concentration skills, and we have listened well in whole class teaching and when working 1:1 with an adult.

This term in literacy we wrote a recount about our experience in the tent. We worked on putting events in order and writing in first person. We then moved onto our second book called 'Ticket to Kalamazoo' where we have looked at alliterations. We had such fun learning about our new vocabulary and have practised our writing skills a lot. Some children even went to Mole class to read out their work.

In number, we have started working on counting in 10s, we have sung songs and practised making tens. We have continued practising adding and subtracting numbers up to 20. We have also looked at length, weight and capacity. We have experimented in seeing which container holds the most liquid, which item is the longest and shortest and which item is the heaviest and lightest.

In science this term we started out by looking at different sound sources. We had a hunt around school looking at different sources and looked at sound vibrations. We have also done some work on electricity, looking at what objects use electricity and the dangers of it.

In other areas of the curriculum, we have practised team games in PE and Netball. In RHSE we looked at the Chinese New Year and tried lots of Chinese food. and in Careers we have looked at the role of a zookeeper and how to care for animals. In art we have looked at the artist Kandinsky and have practiced replicating some of his circle work. We made some really colourful beautiful pictures.



Squirrel Class

We have had a very busy term in Squirrel Class.

In English we have really enjoyed listening to our class story 'Can't You Sleep Little Bear?'. We have matched symbols and words to pictures from the book to support our learning and we have used some brilliant props to retell and sequence the story. We have continued to develop our fine motor skills throughout this term by tracing over patterns and writing letters. We have also looked at the poem 'A Ticket to Kalamazoo'. We matched key words to the poem and have begun to look at alliteration.

In maths we have been practising adding and subtracting numbers to 20. We have looked at money, matching and recognising coins. We have also looked at length, weight and capacity. We have investigated which container holds the most, which object was the longest, shortest, heaviest and lightest. During Science Week we completed some exciting investigations including making a 'volcano' erupt.

In art we have looked at the artist Kandinsky and have had a go at replicating some of his work using different textures and colours.

In PE we practised team games and in life skills we have learned about Chinese New Year. We even tried some yummy Chinese food. In Careers we have looked at the role of Zookeeper and how to care for animals.

We especially enjoyed having Rosie from Darts in for our music lessons. We have played lots of different instruments, and we have done some great listening.



Owl Class

We have had an amazing term in Owl Class.

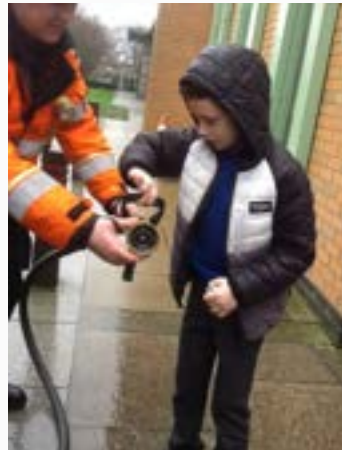
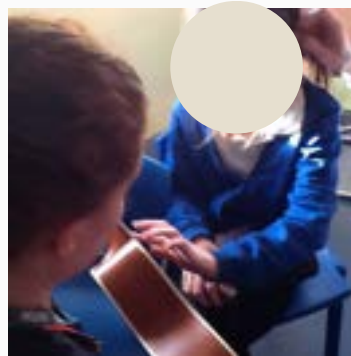
In English sessions we looked at the story 'Can't You Sleep Little Bear?' – where we enjoyed exploring a “dark cave” and using lights to light up the dark cave! We remembered what we had read in the story and were able to write and tell grown-ups what had happened.

In math's we have done a lot more adding and taking away of amounts and we also started to measure things using cubes and hands! We enjoyed celebrating the 'Year of the Horse' as part of the Lunar New Year! We made different things and we also tasted some Chinese food! We all had a go using chopsticks!

In music we created different sounds by tapping, clapping and beating and we also had great music sessions with Rosie from DARTS. She brought in some special instruments that she let us play – including a guitar and electric organ! We had a good time using a microphone to make our voices sound like robots!

We also enjoyed world book day, we especially enjoyed dressing up! We went on a hunt around school to find different characters from stories including Mary Poppins!

We also enjoyed a special visit from the Fire Brigade!



Deer Class

Deer Class have had an amazing spring term!

All of Deer Class have shown real enjoyment exploring different job roles and careers, we have loved learning how people in different roles can help us. We especially enjoyed being able to go into the fire engine and try on some of their equipment.



During this term we have really enjoyed completing a variety of artwork related to our English class stories. We have especially enjoyed working together using different materials. We have utilised our fine and gross motor skills and worked extremely well as a team to make our own big penguin linking to our class story Penguin Huddle.

In Maths we have been looking at a variety of different areas including money, time, number and temperature. We have really enjoyed role-playing, going to a shop, and using the correct money to buy different items that we would like to enjoy. We have also enjoyed looking at numbers in different ways, as well as exploring hot and cold using hot water bottles and ice cubes.



We have continued to develop our independence skills during our cooking lessons, where we have explored healthy and unhealthy foods and different meals, we can make that contain healthy ingredients using a variety of kitchen appliances.

We definitely enjoyed eating what we had made afterwards.

Otter Class

Fantastic engagement on our trip to Magna! We explored how light creates shadows using torches and different objects, and showed great curiosity while discovering the Air, Fire, Water and Earth zones. The fire tornado was a highlight! Well done Otter class for your enthusiasm, excellent learning and great behaviour.



English

During the last half term, pupils used adjectives to describe characters from our class book 'The Penguin Huddle'. They also explored a range of sensory trays which supported them in acting out and experiencing the story in a hands-on way.

This half term our class book has been 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark'. Pupils have been learning about the different characters in the story, exploring what they are and how they live.



Maths

During this term we have been learning about halves and quarters where we were using shapes and numbers. We have been completing word problems that involve addition and subtraction. In the last few weeks we have been extending our understanding on time, o'clock, half past and we are just moving onto quarter past and quarter to the hour.



This term in PE, pupils have been developing important skills through invasion games. These activities help improve movement, coordination, spatial awareness and confidence. Pupils have also been practising turn-taking, following rules and responding to others. This half term we will focus on net and ball skills, including balancing objects on rackets while moving around the hall and hitting different sized balls with a bat towards a target.

In Independence, pupils have been learning how to cross the road safely and how to use zebra and pelican crossings. Pupils have also been learning about the seasons and what to wear in different weather. They are developing confidence when playing games with others and learning about healthy eating, including exploring food with their senses to encourage positive and calm mealtimes.

Badger Class

English

In English, our class text was 'Penguin Huddle'. We had lots of fun exploring ice sensory trays and learning new vocabulary linked to the story. We also learned about adjectives and how they can be used to add detail to our writing. The children carefully chose adjectives to describe the different characters in the story, helping to bring them to life with their words.

Math's

In Math's, we have been learning about time. We began by exploring the difference between day and night and discussing our daily routines. After that, we moved on to telling the time using analogue clocks. First, we made our own clocks, carefully placing the numbers in the correct positions. We then practised using them to tell the time to the hour and the half hour.

Magna Trip

We had a fantastic trip to Magna, where we took part in an engaging workshop about Light and Dark that supported our science learning. After the workshop, we had great fun exploring the different zones: Earth, Air, Fire, and Water. The children's behaviour throughout the day was exceptional, and we were incredibly proud of how everyone represented the school.

Computing

In Computing, we have been learning about online safety. We focused on the key message 'Stop, Close, Tell' (or 'Stop and Tell') to help pupils understand what to do if something appears on the screen that makes them feel uncomfortable or if they need help. The children talked about trusted adults they could go to for support and discussed ways to stay safe when using technology. This learning helped everyone understand how to use the internet in a safe and responsible way.



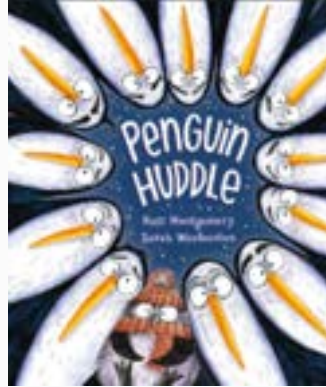
Humber Class

Maths

This term we have covered a lot in math's. We began by spending time looking at money. We looked at the value of coins, how to pay for things and how to calculate change. We even went out to shops to spend money ourselves! We then moved on to multiplication, beginning to double numbers before beginning to work on bigger numbers. We did the same with division – starting with halving and then building on that. Moving on, we looked at time through both clocks and by what events happen at what points of the day.

English

In English, we focused on a heartwarming story called 'Penguin Huddle' about how people can come together to help overcome a problem. We looked at the purpose of a blurb and wrote our own about the book; persuading people to read it using rhetorical questions. We then looked at a book called 'The owl who was afraid of the dark' as part of our light and dark topic. We read the book and looked at vocabulary from it. We then researched Barn owls and wrote a fact file about them using everything we have learnt.



Other curriculum areas

In our wider curriculum we have particularly enjoyed our DofE and travel training sessions where we have explored the wider community – the class have branched out, taking the bus into town, going to a greater variety of shops and places to eat; really growing in confidence!

We used the computers to make music as well as looking at different career paths that are possible during careers week. We have been on 2 trips – an exciting trip to magna during science week to explore the different elements alongside a light and dark workshop. We also visited a church as part of RE, visiting a place that is special to Christians as part of looking at special people and places. We have also been practising our basketball skills in PE, and we have done some work in the community for DofE!



Tower Class

What a fabulous Spring term we have had!

English

This term in English we have learned about how narrative stories have a problem and a solution, and when writing a blurb, the author wants to give away clues about the problem but not the solution to make people want to read the book. We are also writing an explanation text about Barn Owls, based on the book 'The owl who was afraid of the dark'. We have spent time exploring the first chapter of the book as this gave us more description and owl facts, before doing our own research and creating a fact sheet on owls. We focused on the use of question marks this half term.

Maths

We have developed our number knowledge through developing our multiplication and division knowledge, practicing counting in 2s 5s and 10s and using repeated addition to solve problems. Some of us went on to using the multiplication symbols and/or word problems using multiplication facts using manipulatives to support. We then looked at division by sharing, knowing each group had to be equal. We have also had some time to develop our knowledge and skills with time, recognising events and activities we do at different parts of the day before telling the time. We have consolidated the days of the week and months of the year too.

Other curriculum areas

In our wider curriculum we have particularly enjoyed our Art sessions, using a range of media to create an icy scene, considering textures and colours. We also learned about collage and tracing to develop our skills when creating the penguins. In Music sessions, we enjoyed making our own sound makers and using the laptops to create our own music. In PE, we have enjoyed developing our tennis skills and using our new playground to develop our basketball skills, dribbling, dodging and shooting!



The Bridge Class

This term at The Bridge class we have been working really hard. We have visited IKEA where we had a fantastic walk around the factory, we saw automated machines that stacked shelves. We followed the health and safety instructions and walked on the special footpath that went all the way around the factory. There were people driving forklift trucks who hooted their horns at us to let everyone know they were there. We have also taken part in a Careers Week where we talked about different jobs and careers we would like to do and practised some jobs skills in and around The Bridge.

We have taken part in a Science Week; in this we conducted different experiments and observed the effects. We created a volcano and slime; we also took part in a balloon and milk experiment.

We are going Travel Training on a weekly basis where we get the opportunity to visit different places in the community. These have included shopping centres, cafés and restaurants where pupils are able to practise their speaking and listening skills by communicating with people in the local community as well as practising crossing the road safely. We are also preparing for adulthood by becoming more independent when travelling and asking for what we would like.

We are looking forward to our trip to the Arcade and meal out next week and also the Easter Fayre at the end of term.

We would like to take the opportunity to say a big thank you for all of your donations towards our Red Nose Day celebrations.

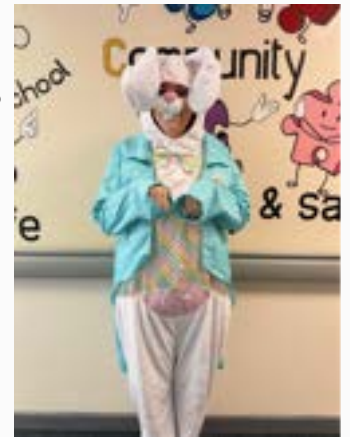
With your help we raised a fantastic £79.45 for the charity.
